### Message from Ms Pike, Headteacher:

Dear Parents and Carers,

Public examinations are now under way and have got off to a great start. Students are conducting themselves extremely well – they seem extremely focused and determined, which is a great sign. We wish them well for the next few weeks!

It is good to get the potentially stressful time that is exam season under way. After the first few sessions, we see students work through very natural initial nerves and start focusing on performance – showing off how much they can do, and how much progress they have made from their early days at FCC. We are pleased to support students through this, and work hard at it, as it is central to all that we do! Quite often, we see students doing what they never believed they were capable of – one of the many reasons that many of us in school love our job!

### 4. Important medical room reminders for Parents and Carers

We would like to reminder parents and carers of the following:

- It is the responsibility of parent/carers to assess the health and wellbeing of their child in the morning before school to ensure that they are well enough to attend school that day.
- FCC will always respect a parent/carer's decisions to send their child into school and therefore will encourage students to continue on for the day once they have arrived.
- Please do not sent your child into school if they report not feeling well before school and you feel they are not fit for school.
- If a student is sent home ill after being unwell in school, they will be marked as ill exactly the same attendance mark as if parents and carers call them in ill.
- Please note that if a student does not follow the medical room/classroom procedure and calls home themselves to be collected, it will be marked as unauthorised.

**Sickness bugs:** If your child has a sickness bug they will need to remain off school until 48 hours after their last episode of sickness and/or diarrhoea to prevent spreading the illness. Students will be sent home if they arrive to school before this time limit.

**Water in school:** Please could parents and carers ensure their child brings a water bottle to school each day to keep them hydrated; we regularly have students coming to the Medical Room with headaches as they have not had a drink since breakfast.

#### 9. FCC U14 girls narrowly miss out on being best in Sussex

On Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> May, FCC U14 girls travelled to Sussex headquarters in Lancing to play in their first County Cup final against Tanbridge House School from Horsham. With a nutritional and tactic meeting the night before, it was great to see lots of pasta lunches and bananas being eating during the day by the team and the energy could really be seen in the game. The team travelled over in the bus with the PE speaker in hand, ready to play music while changing, and Miss Shine and Ruby ran the warm-up.

The game started well for FCC with some early attacking chances from the strikers of Sophia B, Millie and Izzy but it was Grace who ran through the midfield and was taken down by one of their defenders. She stepped up and the free kick just skimmed the left post. With lots of possession in the midfield of Eleanor, Grace, Evie, Hollie and Willow Felpham were playing some fantastic football and creating chances all the time, however the talented defence from Tanbridge were organised enough to ensure shots from Millie, Sophia and Izzy were saved by their goalkeeper.

As well as a talented defence, Tanbridge had a couple of really good and quick strikers. The defence of Hattie, Juliet, Isabelle and Chloe (playing up from year 7) were having to work really hard to repel the constant balls over the top while remaining calm and composed. This was seen from both the left and right side with Chloe and Isabelle working with Izzy and Sophia to move the ball down the line and using Hattie and Juliet for cover. Some of the best football we have played was seen in the first half, but it was Sophia in goal who gave the outstanding performance and made some excellent saves throughout this half; it was from one of these saves that Tanbridge earned a corner and after a goal mouth scramble, their midfielder stuck the ball into the roof of the net to make the game 1-0 to them at half time.

The second half was much the same and possession was even with shots coming in from Millie, Izzy and Grace and fantastic saves again from Sophia; however, it was a shot from their talented striker that found its way into to the bottom corner to make the game 2-0 to them. With 20 minutes to go, the formation changed, and Hattie moved up into midfield which had an instant affect with Evie playing a fantastic ball through to Izzy, who came one-on-one with the keeper, but it was a good save with both of them hitting the floor after the collision. FCC had most of the possession in the final 20 minutes, but the girls could not convert this into any goals.

This game was one of the best I have watched while coaching football - in and out of school - where both teams could have come away with the win. The girls gave 100% with really strong tackles while keeping their discipline and had nothing left to give at the end which was fantastic to see. The way the girls were speaking before, there were some nerves, but it wasn't seen on the pitch and that is commendable.

Well done everyone, you have done FCC proud this year, the second-best team in Sussex is a fantastic achievement.
