## 4. Safeguarding Corner reminder - Keep your children safe from sextortion

Please find below information we would like to share from WSCC:

Since the beginning of last year, Sussex Police has seen a concerning increase in the number of children and young people from West Sussex reporting that they have been a victim of sextortion. Sextortion (also referred to as financially motivated sexual extortion) is a form of blackmail where a perpetrator threatens to reveal intimate images of a victim online unless they give in to their demands.

These demands are typically for money or further images and although this type of blackmail does affect girls, it is actually boys and young men aged between 14 and 17 who are most affected. To help support children and young people and parents and carer we have created a page dedicated to information, guidance and helplines that can support victims of sextortion. This has been created in partnership with our West Sussex County Council Public Health colleagues, Sussex Police and Crawley Borough Council.
