Students in all Year Groups - Job of the week

This week's Job of the Week is <u>network engineer</u>.

Students aged 13 and over - URGENT - Success at Schools

<u>Success at Schools</u> is a careers website aimed at young people aged 13 and over. If you register with the site, you will receive their free careers letter and access to a whole host of useful articles on CV writing, job applications, interviews, gap years, employability skills, volunteering, wellbeing and much more. Register here.

If at least 100 Year 10, 11 or 12 students register by Friday 28th June, the school will receive a set of new subject guides showing how each subject links to careers. To buy these would normally cost the school £249 - so please sign up and help your teachers to help you make the links between school and the world of work.
