Students in Year 8 and above - BrightMed

Applications are now open for students to join the BrightMed programme. BrightMed is working with students in Year 9 to 12 to increase awareness of what it takes to study medicine and healthcare subjects at university and to pursue a career in medicine. Students will have the opportunity to attend 4/5 in-person sessions on the University of Sussex campus, as well as a 4-day, 3-night Summer School in Year 12. These sessions cover a variety of medicine topics, with lectures from guest speakers, interactive activities, and study skills, all supported by current undergraduate medicine students at Brighton and Sussex Medical School.

Students must be currently in Years 8-11, living or studying in Sussex to be able to participate in this programme. Spaces are limited on the programme and as such applicants will also have to meet additional criteria which can be found <u>here</u>
