
Message from Ms Pike, Headteacher:

1. All Parents and Carers of students in Years 7-10 - Locker audit reminder

As we have done for the past two summers, we ask that ALL students return their locker key before the summer break. This allows us to clean all the lockers and re-allocate them so that students, on the whole, have one as close to their classroom as possible.

Regardless of whether your child has a locker now or not, please complete this form by 9pm on Monday 15th July.

The form will ask you to give us details of the locker/key that your child(ren) has/have, if they have one, and whether they would like to have a locker again in September.

Students who currently have a locker but do not want one in the future will be issued a refund of £2 in September, if they have returned this year's key.

If your child/ren would like a locker from September but does not currently have one, please complete the form and make a payment of £5 via ParentPay.

All students wanting a locker in September will be issued their new key on their first day back.

Keys will be collected by tutors on the last day of term, Tuesday 23rd July. If your child will not be in on that date, please arrange for them to empty their locker and hand their key in to the Careers Office (S13a) beforehand.

6. Fortnightly maths challenge

Congratulations to Laila Eldessouki (year 7) and her family for winning the latest fortnightly family maths challenge:

It is well known that the Pobble has no toes and that the three-toed sloth has 12 toes (3 on each of its 4 feet). A synchronised swimming team is made up of 7 Pobbles and 5 three-toed sloths. What is the average number of toes per team member?

The answer is 5 - as 5 three-toed sloths have a total of 60 toes. When combined with the 7 Pobbles there are 12 team members altogether. The average number of toes between them is 60 divided by 12 which is 5.

10. Attendance - Fixed Penalty Notices

Please note that from September, the government is making changes to the penalty notice fines for school attendance. Please see below:

- First Referral That leads to an FPN (Fixed Penalty Notice) being issued, the amount will be £160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days. Reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.
- **Second Referral** That leads to an FPN being issued the amount will be for £160 per parent, per child, with no reduction offered for early payment.
- Third Referral An FPN will not be issued and instead either result in the:
 - Matter being presented directly to the Magistrates Court. A prosecution can result in the parent receiving a criminal record and fines of up to £2,500. Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a Parent's future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education.
 - Matter being addressed via an alternative pathway with an Investigating Officer being allocated.

Year 8 to 12 Students

West Sussex Fire and Rescue Service is trialling an exciting new programme for Fire Cadets and is looking for young people aged between 13 and 17 to apply.

Those successful will be joining a new Fire Cadet unit, based at Bognor Regis Fire Station, to take part in activities inspired by the role and responsibilities of a firefighter, such as completing firefighting drills and learning first aid. Each cadet will also gain essential social, life, work and wellbeing skills. The course is being trialled for one-year and this cohort of cadets will help to shape what a future programme may look like. The new Bognor Regis Fire Cadet unit will be open from 10th September and the team will meet on Tuesday evenings during school term time, 6-8pm.
